## US\$27,000 Grant from the UPS Foundation

Marking National Volunteer Day tomorrow, charity ALONE announces the generous donation of a USD\$27,000 grant (approximately €20,000) from The UPS Foundation, the charitable arm of UPS. The grant has been used to purchase a vital minibus for ALONE, which will be used to transport older persons to social events, hospital appointments, and other necessary activities to help the organisation increase its levels of service to the vulnerable older persons it assists within the community. The purchase of the vehicle coincides with National Volunteer Day which takes place tomorrow, October 1st, a key date in the ALONE diary, as the charity celebrates the support and contribution of the 100 plus volunteers who help the organisation carry out it's crucial work on a daily basis.

A recurring issue for ALONE and the vulnerable older persons it works with has been access to appropriate transportation. This donation, and the vehicle purchased with it, will have a significant impact on how ALONE can best provide the supports necessary for the community it serves. ALONE will make the vehicle available to those in need to transport them to important appointments, to assist those with mobility issues in carrying out their daily activities, and to also transport older persons to frequent social events and evenings which the charity organises.

ALONE has a small and dedicated staff, and is dependent on the input and contribution of the volunteers who work with vulnerable older persons. Volunteerism is the lifeblood of the organisation, and ALONE will be celebrating the work of its volunteers with a special "Volunteers Social" event on Friday October 1st to mark National Volunteer Day. The charity's volunteers come from a wide range of backgrounds, and cover a broad spectrum of ages, interests and abilities. Volunteers work can be specific, such as painting, gardening, or plumbing, as these may be the skills which the volunteer is already in possession of. Most volunteers would be involved in the vital befriending service which the charity provides for older people who are living in isolation or are vulnerable. This service provides a crucial social outlet for the older person, and assists in building self-esteem and confidence.

Seán Moynihan, CEO of ALONE commented "We simply could not continue as an organisation if it wasn't for our volunteers, and the generosity of companies such as UPS, and other companies and individuals. We are deeply committed to the community we serve, and it is the participation and selflessness of the volunteers who work with us on the frontline, not behind the scenes, which helps us to maintain a highly professional level of service for older persons in need. I find their work, approach and attitude inspiring, and I extend our most grateful thanks to all volunteers for their contributions. It's also appropriate that on National Volunteer Day, we thank The UPS Foundation for their extremely generous donation."

"We are extremely proud to extend our support to ALONE to help them continue the fantastic work they do in assisting vulnerable older persons within the community," said Roger Mays, HR Manager, UPS UK & Ireland.
